



What happens when I'm at college?

Being at college is very different to being at school. It may seem like a big step but there are a lot of little things that make it one of the most exciting changes in your education you will ever have.





Less formal – no uniform! Unless you study a course where safety clothing or equipment is required, you can pretty much wear what you like.



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Bigger – nearly all of our courses need to have special facilities and equipment for you to learn with, and we invest millions of pounds each year to make sure they're the best.



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No bell! – With no bells for lessons or teachers in the corridors telling you to get to class you take control of your own time. You can also come and go from site between lessons if you want.

How many courses can I study?

Our courses build your practical skills and knowledge. So, you will only study ONE course with us.

Alongside this you will be encouraged to choose and take part in a variety of personal development and work experience programmes.

If you need to retake either your English or maths GCSE then this will happen alongside your main course until you pass your exam.



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Where will my lessons happen?

Each of our subject areas has a base campus, so you will only ever have to go to one campus for your course.

If you are retaking maths and English or taking part in enrichment activities, you may need to travel to other campuses.





How many days will I be in?

All of our post-16 courses are full-time but that doesn't mean you will be in every day.

- If you do an Apprenticeship you will spend most of your time with your employer and only come in every 6 weeks or so for classes and assessments, or once a week if working on a day release programme.
- If you do either a T level, BTEC, or other vocational qualification you usually spend around 3.5 days in classes each week. The rest of the time is then spent either completing a work placement, work experience, or self-study.



Margaret's bus station.


